| 24.79                  | <b>Declarations of interest in agenda items</b> and requests for dispensation There were none.   |  |

| 24.80                  | Apologies Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs Andrew Hallett, Pam Macklewain-Hallett, John Noone, and Emma Wells.  |  |
| 24.81                  | Minutes of the Town Council meeting held on 14 <sup>th</sup> October 2024 The Council <b>RESOLVED</b> to approve these as a true record of the meeting, and they were signed as such by the Chair.   |  |
| <b>24.82</b><br>24.821 | Updates from minutes (not covered elsewhere on the agenda) Unadopted road between Emgate and Churchyard – the Council heard that Northern Powergrid and Bedale Scouts and Guides have confirmed their contributions to the project, with a reply awaited from the Diocese of Leeds. It is anticipated that the resurfacing work will be completed in early 2025.   |  |
| 24.822                 | Footpath from Masham Road to Calvert Way – the Council agreed that it will add maintenance of this path and its small grass verges to its grounds maintenance scheme of works, effective from 1 <sup>st</sup> December 2024. Maintenance of hedges and trees on land bordering the path remains of course the legal responsibility of the owners of adjacent properties. It was agreed that this no longer needs to be a standing agenda item. |  |
| 24.833                 | Bonfire and fireworks – Cllr Howe congratulated and thanked all those who had been involved in the successful bonfire and fireworks event. The Council heard that donations on the night had increased by £1,000 from 2023, with card machines proving increasingly useful. A financial reconciliation will be presented to the December meeting.  |  |
| 24.824                 | Remembrance Day parade and service – the Council heard that the parade and service had gone very well, with the Deputy Lord Lieutenant and Kevin Hollinrake MP attending, and both sending thanks and approval of the number of families involved. Cllr Howe expressed the Council's gratitude to Rev Simon Moor and all those involved in the organisation of this event.   |  |

| 24.831                 | Reports from external body meetings attended by Councillors  No items were brought to the Council's attention.   |  |
| 24.832                 | <b>Report from North Yorkshire Council member –</b> NYC Cllr David Webster reported that 25% of the county's population are over 65 compared to 18% nationally, with   |  |

implications including health impacts and unclaimed pension credit. He further reported that NYC aims to increase housing by 800 homes per annum, with sites in Scarborough ad Craven identified as possible joint venture developments. In a budget update, it was noted that the NYC financial deficit next year is indicated to be £28.2 million, including increases to employer's national insurance contributions following the budget, and to the cost of social care for adults, and for children with special needs. This will be ameliorated by £11 million of income resulting from the budget's council tax increase payable for second homes. Finally, Cllr Webster noted that there is work to be completed around youth councillor engagement.

#### 24.84 Financial statement and approvals for payment

The Council noted the financial statement and **RESOLVED** to approve the following payments: staff salaries and PAYE; Bedale, Aiskew with Leeming Bar, and Burrill Joint Burial Committee £3,221.52 (precept); Reaction Fireworks £15,500+VAT (fireworks display); North Yorkshire Conveniences £700+VAT (portaloos for bonfire display); Bedale Skip Hire £256.80+VAT (Waste disposal for bonfire display); TJ & CB Services £150 (renovation of Market Place noticeboards); Initial Hygiene £41.01+VAT (service of Bridge St toilets); ECL Plastics £40 (collection boxes for bonfire display); and C. Clarke Graphics £16.97 (lettering for noticeboard).

The Council noted and approved credit card payments to Instantprint of £156.03+VAT (Alfie's Park signage).

Receipts were noted of: £640 (Market stall rentals); £100 (Xmas market stalls); £50 (Bedale Park hire fees); £20 (donation for bonfire and fireworks); £2,036.51 (VAT 126 reclaim); and £14,703.01 (Community Infrastructure Levy).

The cash book balance after these transactions was NOTED as being £42,558.84

#### 24.85 Planning Matters

There were no new applications to consider.

The Council NOTED the approval by North Yorkshire Council of: ZB24/017810/FUL, for a single storey extension to rear of dwelling to form WC, utility and play room at The Greets, 106 South End; ZB24/01824/CAT, for works to trees in a conservation area at Chantry Hall, North End; and NY/2024/0035/FUL, alterations to existing stepped pedestrian access to form new ramped access to main school entrance at Mowbray School, Masham Road.

### 24.86 2025-26 budget

The Council noted the draft budget from the meeting of 4<sup>th</sup> November, and **RESOLVED** to adopt it as the 2025-26 budget, with a precept requirement of £105,242 including the one-off payment for Beckside path renovation agreed as item 24.63.

## 24.87 Metal Detecting

Following two requests, the Council considered issues regarding the potential exploration of Bedale Park by metal detectorists, and **RESOLVED** to not allow detecting on the Park. Reasons for this included but were not limited to the dangers of multiple detectorists asking for permission, and the difficulty of ensuring that disturbed grass surfaces are correctly restored.
